## President's Message

Dear Fellow Members,

As I am writing this year's message, I'm thinking of the devastation that the "tropical storm/hurricane/tornado" caused on 09/27/2024, in our area and western North Carolina. I rode around with Todd Roberson that next morning trying to take in all the downed trees and the damage to our power lines. Then walking around the course thinking of the costs of cleaning up and the lost revenue by having to close the course for who knows how long. We held an emergency Board meeting on Sunday, and we agreed to open the driving range with free balls to give the membership something while we started to clear the course. On Monday, a member stepped up and through his business offered us heavy equipment and labor to clean the course of all the fallen trees, a true blessing. His generosity probably saved our club \$100,000. Let that sink in, saved us over \$100,000. Our insurance agent then notified us that our policy allowed for some of the cost of tree removal, and to repair the damage to the restroom on hole #6, another blessing. We are still waiting for an answer regarding the recovery of lost revenue. There were, at best count, 85 downed trees and while having to close the front and back at various times, all 18 holes were open for play by 10/11. Todd and the ground crew did an amazing job of clearing greens, clearing fairways, mowing and getting The Nash back to normal, working without a day off. Quite an achievement for a small crew. There are others to thank but are also too humble and too numerous to name.

The monetary losses due to the storm, the closing of the course, and the higher costs of living hurt our cash flow. Over the past several years to present our Finance Committee has done a great job of having funds set aside. These funds have helped to lease Grounds equipment, repair and upgrade areas of the club house, and will re-plaster our pool, which is badly needed to prevent future cracking.

We increased the dues last year but due to the economic climate we have not seen any gain or benefit from that increase. We had our club's insurance policy cancelled and the new policy has a premium of \$56,000, an increase of \$28,000 over our old policy. This is the primary reason the Board has found it necessary to increase dues by \$10 per month.

Let's not forget the hailstorm late last year. Through insurance and, again, help from our membership, we were able to get new roofs on the club house, pool house and pump house. The black fencing around the pool, the railing to the club house balcony and staircase were able to be repainted as well.

The Presidents Dinner, was again, a complete success, so I heard, (Covid finally hit the Watson household). Mitchell Humpries received the President's Award for his long-time

service and dedication to Cherokee National. As a self-described “sorry @\$ electrician”, he took care of all our needs for years. Mitchell was instrumental in upgrading the wiring and installing the chargers for our new electric carts. Shortly after receiving the award, Mitchell suffered a health issue, may we all keep him in our prayers, his happy spirit is truly missed.

Our Course Superintendent, Mr. Todd Roberson, worked his magic as usual this year, giving us the best greens in the Upstate, with the smallest budget and crew.

Our Pro, Mr. Daniel Agapion, took our PGA Juniors to the regional finals in Callaway Gardens, GA. They lost by 0.5 strokes to the eventual winner. I watched Danny work with these kids during the middle of the summer and listened as he encouraged them while meeting in his office.

It’s easy to criticize these two men, but follow them around for a couple of days, you would be amazed at all that they do and the hours they put in. They deserve our thanks and respect.

I learned quite a bit about Cherokee National this year. I found that the Board members had a true heart for our club. I was fortunate to have them and their committee members guiding me. I also realized how many members truly love this place. They care about the youth and the future of the club. There are members that volunteer their time to help maintain the club, volunteer to help with tournaments and bring forward true concerns with viable answers. I’m asking those who have never been involved in joining a committee to sit in at a meeting, you don’t have to be an expert in the pool, greens or finance. You’d be amazed at just how this club does operate.

I was also disappointed in the lack of concern for our club and respect for their fellow members. Trash left and thrown on the ground, driving the carts everywhere and anywhere, not paying to play and the inability to rake the bunkers. Also, the lack of members’ involvement. Again, please get involved with a committee, once a month for an hour. I guarantee you’d be impressed.

It’s been a love/hate relationship this past year, but an honor to serve the membership. Thank you for your trust.

I also had lots of joy coaching as an assistant the Upstate PGA Junior League All Star Team which won the Carolinas PGA Section. We lost by 1 point (Match Play format) to Georgia Section Team which went on to win The Nationals in Texas. Representing Cherokee National were Rilen Kozic and Caleb Green – both played excellent all year long. It was a very memorable PGA Junior League season and all our kids who played made me proud. It has been a very good tournament season - see member tournament results later in this newsletter. Outside tournaments have been very profitable for the club this year. Some may ask why we have outside tournaments. To be frank, it’s a great revenue source for the club. We added over \$50K to the bottom line which helps keep our member dues so low. The staff does an excellent job managing these events and we also do our best to accommodate regular members play on the day of the event.

I believe we offer an excellent product to our members at a great VALUE. With that said, I would like to thank Todd and his staff for keeping the golf course in great shape and thank the golf shop staff for providing excellent service to our members and their guests. I don’t know of any PRIVATE CLUB in the Carolinas that dues are from \$90 to \$140 per month, play only 22,000 rounds and have a golf course as good as ours with very little debt service. I tribute to many good decisions made over the past 20 years by our board, our members’ support and our employees’ dedication. Sometimes we forget how valuable our employees are. I would like to thank all of them for sacrificing many holidays, weekends, and late nights to serve our members. In my opinion, we have the best staff since I have been here. We are always trying to figure out ways to make more money for the club so we can put the money back in the club to make it nicer.

It seems like every year we have a member who steps up when the club needs it most, and one did that this year. Hurricane Helene knocked over 100 trees. In the big scheme of things, we were very lucky compared to some of our nearby communities. Being a long time, Golf Professional / General Manager on the Outer Banks of NC I know what it is like to clean up after a hurricane. Our generous member was at the club hours after the storm and he planned on how to get this place cleaned up so we could play golf very soon. He then presented the plan to the board and in just a couple days had several huge pieces of equipment, chain saws and operators onsite - we played golf only a couple days later. Thank you! We would also like to thank Tyler Scruggs and the volunteers for what they did to help.

## POOL COMMITTEE REPORT

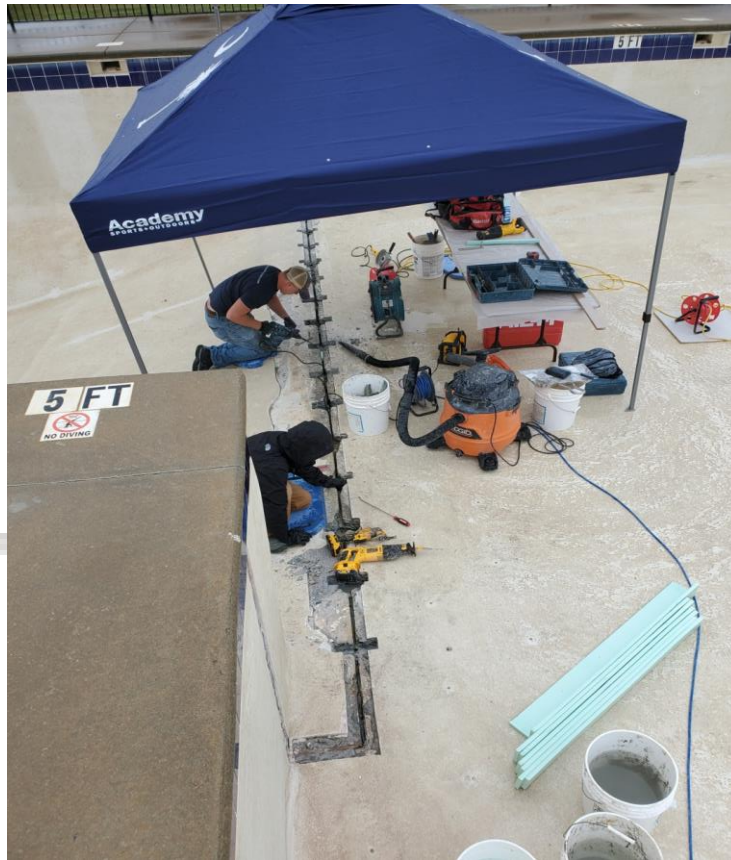

Just after the 2023 Annual Meeting, we incurred a large leak in the pool. After arranging for an inspection and pressure test, Pool Leak Solutions found a crack in the return line about a foot inside the wall in the corner near the Clubhouse and parking lot. It turned out to be a crack in a “T” about 24” deep. A repair was made, and the deck was covered with new cement.



This 3,000 gal/day leak was behind us, however, we still had a major plaster failure discovered in early 2023 and a leak near the expansion joint leading into the deep end. Slab Solutions from Greer drilled about 80 holes and injected foam to assure the concrete floor was supported. They felt the pool floor was in good shape considering the 60 year old age. Pool Leak Solutions from Inman came in and removed the broken plaster around the expansion joint and the 20 year old expansion joint seal. Staples were installed across the joint to minimize movement and a new, multi-stage expansion joint was installed. New safety tiles and plaster were applied to blend the area where the old plaster had failed. Water levels have been consistent since this repair was completed in May 2024.

We hosted a lifeguard certification class in early May which resulted in some small revenue. We again allowed our members to host small pool parties for special occasions, again generating some small revenue.

As a result of the hailstorm that affected so many in Grassy Pond, the Pool House roof was replaced along with the Club House roof through a claim with our insurance. DHEC made several inspections throughout the year and commended us on our thoroughness in keeping our Logbook accurate and up to date.

We have provided a new storage locker in the cart barn to store Pool Committee games and accessories.

A new pool strainer (60 years old) and pump (20 years old) which is leaking badly are currently on order. We expect to install these two items in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2025.

The re-plastering of the pool is Ten (10) years past due after the 2004 pool renovation, and may have been the cause of several other plaster cracks over the past 4-5 years. The Board authorized a major re-plastering of the entire pool in early 2025.

## GREENS COMMITTEE REPORT

From losing two long-time, experienced maintenance staff members early in the year to dealing with aging equipment in Hurricane Helene's aftermath, this has been a challenging year to say the least. As a committee we would like to thank Todd Roberson

and the rest of the maintenance staff for all they do to keep the course in great shape, Curt Humphries for the support he provides to Todd in maintaining the club's equipment, and a special, huge thank you to our generous member for doing so much to clean up the course from the destruction left behind by the hurricane. Without his generosity there was no way we would have been able to open the course back up as soon as we did. Thank you to the membership for your cooperation and patience during that time.

Even with these obstacles, we have been able to accomplish a lot this past year. I've highlighted some of those below.

- We were able to reshape the right bunker on #2 and solve the washout problem from heavy rains and replace the sand. The disturbed area was resodded and we will continue to give attention to this area as it matures.
- The dead areas on the #6 tee boxes were replaced with sod.
- Sod was added and some minimal grading was done for better drainage of rainwater from the cart path at the bottom of the hill on #8.
- The drainage issue in the right greenside bunker on #11 was corrected and the sand was replaced.
- Replaced the sand in the right greenside bunker on #14.
- Installed the new satellites for the sprinkler system throughout the course and replaced over 30 sprinkler heads.
- Removed many dead or dying trees around the course.
- Added an additional rake to every trap / bunker on the course.
- Replaced 4 of the deteriorated water cooler houses. Thank you to Will Coggins for working with The Institute of Innovation to build these for us. (We hope to have the last one for the driving range soon.)
- Obtained an additional rough mower, replaced the mower that mows areas where large roots, stumps, ruts, etc. are present and obtained a new blower for the course.
- Added sand buckets for filling divots on the driving range. (Please use the provided sand to fill your divots before you leave the range. Also, refer to the new signs on the range tee box that show the proper way to make divots which will encourage faster recovery time of the turf.)

In the coming year we have other course improvement projects that we are keeping on our radar such as:

- A limited amount of additional tree removal to improve turf conditions in specific areas
- Additional grading to for better drainage in low lying areas
- Leveling up any tee boxes that need it; i.e. #17 purple tee box
- Replacing sand in a handful of bunkers that still have the old sand
- We still have more sprinkler heads to replace, and we'll address those as time allows.

Lastly, please remember to check to see if we cover greens this winter when temps get in low 20's.

## FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Thank you to the finance committee members: Jim Inman, Brad Wilkins, Wade Hardin, Andy Painter, and Jimmy Randolph. As a first-year committee chairman I appreciate the experience and support all of you contributed to the finance committee this year.

Overall, the club is in good financial standing. Our income continues to increase; however, inflation and new expenses are still outpacing that income. This year we had a couple of larger new expenses that will be added to our operating budget for 2025. We needed to replace aging rough mowers and blowers to keep the course in good playable condition. This equipment will be leased, and those new payments will start in January. Another large new expense added to the budget was our business operating insurance costs. Our existing policy expired in 2024 and the only new policies available are double the cost of the previous policy. This is not due to anything our club did or did not do, but rather the current nature of the golf course insurance world. It is frustrating from a financial perspective to have such a large cost increase for an item that club members cannot see. Unfortunately, these new expenses will result in a member dues increase for 2025. We all understand the frustration with inflation, but there aren't enough budget items that can be cut to offset these new expenses.

Some other required maintenance items will be paid for from capital accounts the club has built up, and therefore are not included in the 2025 operating budget. This includes replacing an irrigation pump and replastering the pool. Both these projects are being planned for Spring 2025.

If after reviewing the proposed 2025 budget, you have any constructive ideas to help the club generate more income or reduce expenses, the finance committee is always ready to listen.

That wall has since been repaired and we were able to find matching paneling. The
